

Hygiene Protection Concept and Framework Conditions

For language exams at the German-American Institute Nuremberg e.V., the following hygiene requirements and rules of conduct for the prevention of Covid-19- infections must be observed:

- Persons with cold symptoms (also in mild form) as well as persons who knowingly had contact with a confirmed COVID-19 infected person in the last 14 days are excluded from the event.
- We reserve the right to change or postpone the program under certain circumstances.
- 2G rules apply (vaccinated or recovered).
- Wearing an FFP2 mask when entering the house / venue is mandatory. The mask may only be removed when sitting down as long as a minimum distance of 1.50 m is maintained. The same applies to teachers/lecturers.
- No group formation/group work (before, during or after the event).
- Avoid touching the same objects if possible.
- Group work is not permitted.
- Door handles/tables/reusable work materials are disinfected after the exam.
- Regular ventilation of the exam room takes place after 45 minutes and after each exam.
- To enable contact tracing in the event of a subsequently identified COVID-19 case among the visitors/participants, the contact data of the visitors/participants (surname, first name, place of residence, telephone number or e-mail address, period of stay/duration) will be forwarded to the competent health authorities on request if the number of participants exceeds 1000.

Basic Rules:

- In case of (corona-specific) signs of illness (e.g. fever, dry cough, breathing problems, loss of sense of taste/smell, sore throat, pain in the limbs, nausea/vomiting, diarrhea), please stay at home.
- Good hand hygiene (regular hand washing with soap for 20 - 30 seconds).
- Adherence to coughing and sneezing etiquette (coughing or sneezing into the crook of the arm or into a handkerchief, which is then disposed of).
- Keeping a distance (at least 1.5 m) from other people, also when entering and leaving the building.
- Wearing mouth-to-nose coverings (FFP2-mask).
- No physical contact (avoid shaking hands and hugging).
- Keeping hands away from face (avoiding touching eyes, nose and mouth).
