Female Empowerment

This introductory 90-minute workshop will investigate the history and development of women's rights, from its 19th century beginnings to present-day campaigns spanning the globe. They will gain answers to questions about true gender equality and whether we can ever achieve it. Looking at issues that face women and girls, particularly, students will be able to explore discriminatory practices that are still used in some parts of the globe to oppress 50% of the population, holding back progress and development for whole nations. Also available as a 120 or 180-minute workshop, the extended versions include the introductory workshop explained above, alongside additional content.

The 120-minute workshop offers supplementary time to work interactively on a group project, taking a closer look at specific nations whose practices support the development of women compared to those who do not.

The 180-minute workshop offers additional research on a topic of interest tailored for each group. We will look closely at the debates that have been used to keep women in certain positions in society and those that have helped end patriarchal systems. This workshop will focus on leading women (and men) who have led the fight for all women, everywhere. Includes video and article research.
